



ROYAL JELLY

What is Royal Jelly?

Royal jelly is a milky secretion produced by honey worker bees to help nurture queen bees. Royal jelly is essentially the nutrient-rich fuel that helps the queen bee grow and thrive. While all larvae are fed royal jelly for the first three day of life, larvae chosen by the worker bees to become queens are bathed in royal jelly in special queen cells throughout their development. After the larval stage is complete and the queen bee emerges, she is fed royal jelly throughout her life. This royalty-only classification gave way to royal jelly's name. Today, beekeepers harvest some of the royal jelly from beehives and make it available for use in supplements and health products.

Royal jelly is a nutrient-rich superfood used as a health tonic and wellness booster supplement. It contains lots of protein, amino acids, healthy fats, vitamins, and minerals. In its fresh form, it is roughly 66% water, 13% protein, 15% carbohydrate, 5% fatty acids, and 1% trace elements. It contains all the B vitamins, and traces of vitamin C. Royal jelly also contains collagen (the major protein in our skin, hair, nails, bones, and veins), and several antioxidant enzymes.

In cultures around the world, royal jelly has been used to promote a healthy and long life. Because it's such a precious substance (so little is made, and it's not easy to harvest), historical use was mostly for royalty, just like in the honey bee hive. In traditional Chinese medicine, royal jelly is called "food of the emperors", and has long been prescribed to lengthen life, promote energy and vitality, and prevent illness. Royal jelly has also been used by the maharajahs of India, who have long valued the substance as a key to maintaining youthful energy. In ancient Egypt, royal jelly was given to the pharaohs, promoting their longevity.

Q. How much Royal Jelly do I take and when should I take it?

A. While there are no formal guidelines regarding dosage, it is important to start with very small amounts of royal jelly. People may take royal jelly safely in moderate amounts, but they should stop using it immediately if there is any sign of allergic reaction. We suggest taking one serving of royal jelly in the morning on an empty stomach, for increased absorption, and a second serving later in the day.

Q. Do I need to refrigerate Royal Jelly?

A. No. Since our Royal Jelly is made from freeze dried concentrate and is uniquely preserved, it can remain stable without refrigeration and will not lose its quality, potency and integrity.

Q. What is Royal Jelly concentrate?

A. Royal jelly concentrate is fresh royal jelly that has been freeze dried to remove its moisture. This concentrates the substance. It's typically concentrated at a rate of 3x to 3.5x, and the dosage is usually listed as the equivalency in fresh royal jelly. For example, a 500mg concentrate at 3x potency would be marketed as a 1,500mg dose because that's the equivalent amount of fresh royal jelly contained in each serving.

Q. Is your Royal Jelly mixed with honey?

A. No, it is not mixed with honey. Our Royal Jelly contains royal jelly concentrate, purified water and organic vegetable glycerin. We only use simple ingredients and like to keep the junk out. The organic vegetable glycerin we use is derived from non-gmo palm trees. Vegetable glycerin is used in the food industry as a natural sweetener that does not have an effect on blood sugar. It also acts as a natural preservative by depriving bacteria and spores of moisture to render them sterile, without negatively affecting desired compounds.

Our unique blending process allows us to slightly re-hydrate royal jelly concentrate and preserve it, thereby making it stable outside of refrigeration. What makes fresh royal jelly difficult to bring to the online marketplace is its requirement to be refrigerated. Fresh royal jelly is expensive and requires costly shipping with ice packs and temperature controlled packaging. What we offer is a unique royal jelly product at less than half the price of fresh royal jelly.

Q. What does Royal Jelly taste like?

A. Royal jelly has a unique taste that many people grow to love. It has a naturally bitter sweet taste. To help ease the bitterness we have added organic glycerin which offers a natural sweetness. You could also mix it with quality raw honey, as these two bee products work together in a harmonious (and tasty!) manner.

Q. Can Royal Jelly be used for skin care and anti-aging?

A. Yes, royal jelly is used cosmetically, and increasingly so! You can apply our Royal Jelly as a serum to your skin if desired. After passing through US Customs and FDA Inspection, a multitude of laboratory tests are performed that include: ICP-MS heavy metal test (Hg, As, Pb, Cd), FTIR purity test, UV-Vis potency test, Titration potency test, Microbiology contamination test, Loss on drying, pH, density and particle size. You can rest assured that you will receive a product that has been fully tested, produced using current good manufacturing practices (cGMP) and is of the highest quality.
